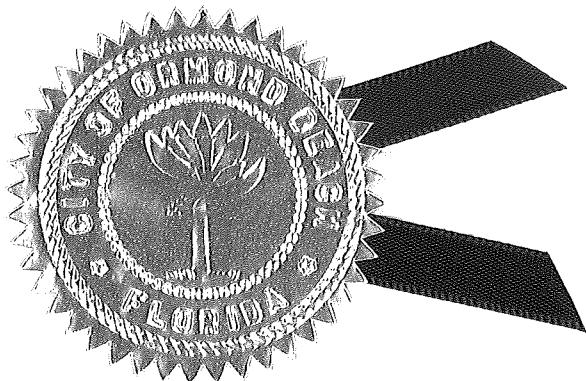
**WHEREAS**, Elizabeth is 100 years "young" today and celebrating a "birthday blessing" at Temple Beth-El with family and friends;
