

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, hospice and palliative care empower people to live as fully as possible, surrounded and supported by family and loved ones, despite serious and life-limiting illness; and

WHEREAS, hospice and palliative care bring patients and family caregivers the highest quality care delivered by an interdisciplinary team of skilled professionals that include physicians, nurses, social workers, therapists, counselors, health aides, spiritual care providers and others who make the wishes of each patient and family a priority. Through pain management and symptom control, caregiver training and assistance, and emotional and spiritual support, patients can live fully up until their final moments, surrounded and supported by the faces of loved ones, friends, and committed caregivers; and

WHEREAS, Haven Hospice believes that everyone deserves compassion, care and comfort. Haven Hospice served more than 14,853 patients and families throughout their 19-county service area in 2015, including providing grief counseling and support to 8,628 individuals and families; and

WHEREAS, last year, more than 1.6 million Americans living with life-limiting illness, and their families, received care from the nation's hospice programs in communities throughout the United States; and

WHEREAS, hospice and palliative care providers encourage all people to learn more about options of care and to share their wishes with family, loved ones, and their healthcare professionals; and
