BENEFITS AND RETIREMENT

- Police Officers are vested in pension plan after ten years of credited service
- Police Officers may elect normal retirement at age 60; or age 52 with 25 years of credited service
- Police Officers are eligible for normal retirement with 10 years of service at age 55
- Optional tax deferred and Roth retirement investment plans are available
- Personal leave time begins at 12 days per year with 10 paid holidays
- Medical, dental, and vision insurance premiums at no cost (Dependent coverage available)
- Long term disability, AD&D, and basic life insurance at no cost (Dependent coverage available)
- Continued education assistance program
- Employee Assistance Plan
- Alternative uniform allowing tattoos with shorts, hats, facial hair options and outer vest carriers
- Take home vehicles for officers who are Volusia and Flagler County residents
- Overtime details
- Physical Fitness Incentive Program

- Permanent days or nights yearly rotation with shift differential pay

For sworn positions, a minimum of 19 years of age; possession of a High School Diploma, GED or other certificate of competency; a Florida Law Enforcement Certification; and excellent moral character (no felony convictions or misdemeanor convictions involving moral turpitude.)
